Examination committee members for medical imaging and radiation therapy

Te Poari Ringa Hangarau Iraruke | The Medical Radiation Technologists Board (the Board) is seeking Expressions of Interest (EOI) from registered medical imaging and radiation therapy (MIRT) health practitioners to join our examination committee.

Background

Under the Health Practitioners Competence Assurance Act 2003 (the Act) we have a responsibility to protect the health and safety of the public by providing mechanisms to ensure practitioners are fit and competent to practise within Aotearoa New Zealand.

The Board holds an online examination. This is primarily used for internationally qualified applicants seeking registration in Aotearoa New Zealand, to determine their foundational knowledge in the scopes of practice.

To assist with this process, we seek suitably qualified practitioners to act as members of the examination committee. Members will be interested in using their professional expertise to help with ensuring the exam process is fair, valid, and robust.

What's required

Being on the examination committee involves providing expert advice and oversight for the Board's examination and ensuring the examination is fit for purpose.

Examination committee members must be experienced, respected, registered Board health practitioners with current knowledge and experience of current good practice in medical imaging and/or radiation therapy.

What it takes - time/location commitment

As an examination committee member, you may be required to meet online up to four times a year, and each meeting may take up to four hours.

There may also be one-off face-to-face meetings where required.

You will be required to review information prior to preparing for online meetings.

As this work is carried out online members must have access to a secure computer.

The examination committee is supported by the Board's Secretariat staff.

Remuneration

All members are paid in alignment with the Board's fees structure.

Involvement in the exam committee also contributes to professional development hours.

Any travel and accommodation requirements are booked - and paid for - by the Board.

What makes a member eligible

To be eligible for a role on the committee you must:

- hold a current practising certificate
- have been registered and practising with the Board for more than five years
- be in good standing with the Board – which means there must be no current concerns about your competence or fitness to practise, or complaints about your conduct.

All practitioner members will be appointed by the Board and will be required to sign confidentiality agreements and manage any conflicts of interest as part of their contract for services.
