While it shows that overseas MITs have dropped by 48 new registrations, the MIT APC holders have increased by 44 in the 2020/2021 year. This indicates that already registered MITs have either returned to practise in New Zealand or stayed in New Zealand and obtained a 2020/2021 APC.

In addition, new registrations for MRITs have increased from 16 in the 2019/2020 year to 27 in the 2020/2021 year.

Getting your COVID-19 Vaccination

To register for your COVID-19 vaccination, the Medical Radiation Technologists Board advises medical imaging and radiation therapy practitioners to contact their DHB or employer.

COVID-19 Vaccine Education and Training

The Board has been asked to disseminate the below information from the Immunisation Advisory Centre (IMAC):

The IMAC are a nationwide organisation based at the School of Population Health at The University of Auckland. They provide New Zealanders with a local source of independent, factual information based on international and New Zealand scientific research regarding vaccine-preventable diseases and the benefits and risks of immunisation.

Medical imaging and radiation therapy practitioners are able to vaccinate within their current scope (with appropriate training). Therefore IMAC would like to provide online training, support and education to assist you to become COVID vaccinators. In providing this training and information IMAC can also ensure your client base has access to accurate information around the COVID vaccines and to provide support and increase confidence within this workforce when having vaccine conversations.
