#### YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

Once you are registered, you have a legal requirement to notify the Board of any changes to your residential, postal or work address within one month of the change. You can do this by logging into "My Profile" on the website.

#### BOARD'S RESPONSIBILITY

The primary responsibility of the Board is to protect the health and safety of the New Zealand public by ensuring practitioners registered with the Board are competent and fit to practise.

#### 2020-2023 CPD Triennium

The 2020-2023 triennium covers 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2023. The minimum requirements are:

- 60-hours of CPD within the three-year cycle (triennium)
- at least 10 hours of CPD each year
- 35 hours CPD must relate to activities classified as substantive CPD

The Board has agreed that there will be no audit for practitioners in 2021, meaning that the first audit for the 2020-2023 triennium will be in 2022. The Board recognises that throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, practitioners are likely to have had difficulties accessing the usual channels and methods to undertake learning and development activities to meet their CPD requirements. However, practitioners are encouraged to continue to take opportunities to undertake CPD activities when they are available.

Remember, updating your CPD records as you go will reduce the stress should you be audited.

## 2017 -2020 Triennium CPD Audit

We have completed the audit for the 2017-2020 triennium. There were 619 practitioners selected for this year's audit. Excluding those practitioners who were granted an exemption, the audit response rate was 99%, and the pass rate was 98%.

Auditors reported that the practitioner portfolios were of a high standard. However, some practitioners could have provided more in-depth reflections.

## **Online Examination Update**

In 2019 the Board launched the Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy examinations. The intention is to offer the Nuclear Medicine, Ultrasound and Magnetic Resonance Imaging examinations for the first time in December 2020. Registration for these exams opens in late November 2020.

## Revision of the Register

The Board is attempting to locate registered practitioners it does not hold address or other contact information for, and who have not been in touch with the Board for some time. The Board wishes to revise its register to remove the names of any practitioners who are no longer in practice. If your name, if you know someone who appears on the list, please make contact with the Board at mrt@medsci.co.nz.

## **Consultation**

# Simpson Report

The Health and Disability System Review was charged with recommending system-level changes that would be sustainable, lead to better and more equitable outcomes for all New Zealanders and shift the balance from the treatment of illness towards health and wellbeing. The report discusses a range of detailed proposals regarding all the elements that need to change for the New Zealand health and disability system to produce more equitable health outcomes and to become more financially sustainable. Section 11, page 190-192 mentions the registration requirements for MRIs in New Zealand in comparison to Australia and other overseas-trained MRIs. The link to the report is here.
